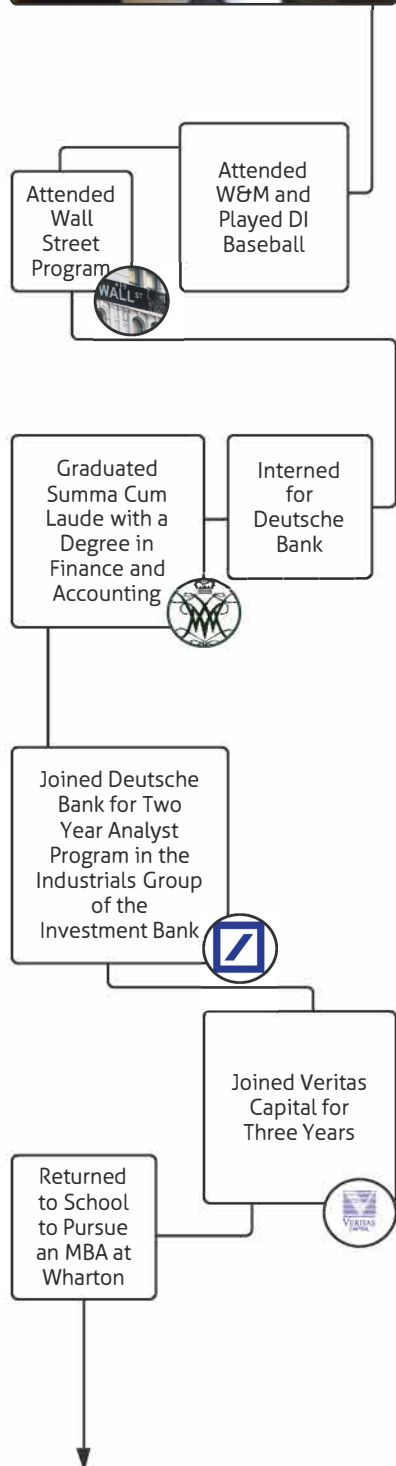


Aaron Hurwitz

Upon entering The College of William & Mary in the fall of 2004, Aaron did not know what he wanted to do after graduation. As a student, he was focused on earning a strong GPA, succeeding in his business classes and playing on the baseball team.

Aaron was an active college student. As a Division I athlete, he spent at least 30 hours a week training, practicing and playing an approximately 60 game season. He was also the Vice President of the Howard J. Busbee Finance Academy. He knew he liked finance and accounting, but was not sure which career path to pursue. During his junior year, Aaron went on the Wall Street Program with the Cohen Career Center. The trip gave him the opportunity to visit multiple banks and explore a variety of different paths within the financial services industry. During the trip, he spoke to a number of alumni and decided he was interested in pursuing an investment banking internship because of his interest in corporate finance and the steep learning curve the job provides.

Aaron spent the summer prior to his senior year as an intern in Deutsche Bank's Industrials Group. At the end of the summer, he accepted an offer to join the group's two year Analyst Program.

After graduating Summa Cum Laude in 2008, Aaron hit the desk at Deutsche Bank approximately three weeks before Lehman Brothers collapsed. It was a tumultuous time in the industry, but Aaron gained valuable experience working on mergers, divestitures, leveraged buyouts and financings across aerospace and defense, diversified and other industrial subsectors.

Following his two years at Deutsche Bank, Aaron joined Veritas Capital, a government services, healthcare, and defense focused Private Equity firm with ~\$2 billion under management. During his three years at Veritas, Aaron had the opportunity to work on many leveraged buyouts, add-on acquisitions, and spent time working with the management of portfolio companies.

In 2013, in the interest of furthering his career, Aaron decided to return to school to pursue an MBA at the Wharton School, University of Pennsylvania. Aaron is currently in his first year of the two year MBA program.
