She is also the CEO and co-founder of a new venture, Belay Guidance Company, that puts preventative science at parents' fingertips with their digital mental health platform of customized, real-time expertise that makes today easier and the future brighter.

Earlier in her career Megan was Senior Advisor to the CEO for Points of Light and founding President of the Civic Incubator where she built new enterprises through mergers/acquisitions and joint ventures between for-profits and non-profits.

At McKenna, Long & Aldridge, Megan led the firm-wide philanthropic and community impact strategy including a multi-faceted effort to fight human trafficking nationwide. She also worked closely with the founders of Green Print as strategic advisor and early-stage investor helping build the carbon investment strategy and negotiate social purpose partnerships as they launched a sustainability solutions company.

She has served as Chair of the Board of Visitors for Emory University as well as on the boards of Wake Forest University's Advisory Council on Entrepreneurship & Innovation and Candler School of Theology. Peter Ginsberg

Chief Operating Officer Foundation Fighting Blindness

Peter Ginsberg joined Foundation Fighting Blindness in 2020 and is now chief operating officer, with responsibility for finance, corporate partnering, professional outreach, IT and strategic opportunities. He is also on the management team for the RD Fund (Retinal Degeneration Fund), the Foundation's venture capital fund. Foundation Fighting Blindness is the leading foundation focused on retinal disease research and celebrated its 50th anniversary in 2021. In connection with his Foundation role, Ginsberg co-founded Opus Genetics, which was incorporated and raised its \$19 million seed financing in 2021. Opus Genetics is a patient-first, science driven gene therapy company tackling manufacturing obstacles standing in the way of treatments for rare blinding retinal diseases. Prior to joining the Foundation, Ginsberg served as vice president of business development at Savara Pharmaceuticals (SVRA), an orphan lung disease company. Previously, he headed business development for BioDelivery Sciences (BDSI), United Therapeutics (UTHR), and SurModics (SRDX). Ginsberg also served as VP of business & technology development for the North Carolina Biotechnology Center, where his group financed and advised emerging life science companies. He further spent 15 years in the healthcare investment industry, during which time he was named a Wall Street Journal All-Star as Piper Jaffray's lead biotechnology analyst. Ginsberg serves as a steering committee member for the Bespoke Gene Therapy Consortium and is a Chartered Financial Analyst and member of the CFA Institute. He earned an A.B. in Economics from Princeton University and an M.B.A. from the Tuck School of Business at Dartmouth College.
